Special Projects:

Parker Ito: *From Me 2 U, From U 2 Me* is an iPad lounge celebrating creative leisure. The lounge will feature 6 custom bean bags covered in digitally printed fabrics created by artists Petra Cortright, Aude Pariset, Jon Rafman, Kate Steciw, Katja No Vitksova, and Dora + Maja.

Coco Fusco: *The Empty Plaza/La Plaza Vacía* is a single-channel video. Inspired by the organized public protests in the Middle East beginning in 2011, Fusco took note of the communal spaces around the world being utilized and, in contrast, those left empty. The empty Plaza de la Revolución in Havana, Cuba becomes the protagonist in Fusco's meditation on public space, revolutionary promise, and memory. Intermittent close-range views bring the Plaza's architecture into focus; long takes documenting Fusco's passage through the vacant square are punctuated by vintage archival footage depicting scenes from Post-Revolutionary Cuba. Throughout the duration of the video, a Spanish narration, written by acclaimed Cuban journalist Yoani Sanchez, describes what appears—and does not appear—in view.

Central Fine presents *Diana Speaking to Animals*, a special performance by **Georgia Sagri**. Sagri's work is concerned with a re-definition of performative practices, while addressing Poetry, De-Centralization, Hyper Abstraction and their existence against the demands of a standardized understanding of the notions of culture and praxis.

"The Skull Sessions" are a series of collaborative works by **Tim Hyde** and **Andrea Galvani**. Each session is a recording of an action, a conversation, or a journey that is remixed and translated into physical form.

UNTITLED. is a temporary exhibition forum for international galleries and non-profit art spaces with a focus on emerging and mid-career artists. The fair will take place December 5-9, 2012 and is located on the beach in the heart of South Beach at Ocean Drive and 12th Street (walking distance from the convention center). UNTITLED. Miami Beach is housed in a unique temporary tent structure suffused with natural light and takes full advantage of the unique attributes of its environmental surroundings.

UNTITLED.'s emphasis on international living artists will result in a presentation of some of the most exciting contemporary art from across the globe. A curated program of talks, artist commissions and studio visits will be scheduled in conjunction with UNTITLED.
